4. *William Middleton, of London, goldsmith. He was one of the original Adventurers named in the Charter of the New River Company, and was probably the William Middleton sworn burgess of Denbigh in 1629, who died in 1640.*

5. *Thomas Middleton.*

6. *Richard Middleton, of London, merchant. Probably the "Richard Middleton, of London, grocer," named as one of the original Adventurers in the Charter of Incorporation of the New River Company, and he may have been the Richard Middleton, a member of the Council of the Island of Bermuda, in 1623. He married Jane, daughter of John Westwray and widow (1) of James Wyche, and (2) of . . . Proctor. Richard Middleton, died in London in 1652, leaving two daughters:—*
