

7 *Henry Middleton*, bapt. at St. Matthew's 14 June, 1607. His descendants eventually succeeded to the representation of the family. (*Vide postea.*)

8. *Elizabeth Middleton*, bapt. at St. Matthew's Oct., 1608, living and unmarried in 1643. Executrix to her mother's will.

9. *Anne Middleton*, bapt. at St. Matthew's 13 May, 1610; died unmarried 1635. Will dated 20 Oct., 1635.

10. *John Middleton*, bapt. at St. Matthew's 13 Oct., 1611; died s.p. before 1623.

11. *Hester Middleton*, bapt. at St. Matthew's 10 Jan., 1612-13. Married Richard Price of Gogerddau, co. Cardigan, Esq. He was created a Baronet Aug. 9, 1641, and was buried in Westminster Abbey 21 Oct., 1651, having survived his wife. His line failed in 1694.

12. *Mary Middleton*, "sixth daughter and twelfth child," M.I. at Edmonton.

13. *Simon Middleton*, baptism not found, but he is named in the wills of both father and mother. He founded the line of Middleton of Edmonton and Hackney (*see pedigree*).

In addition to the foregoing 13 children, Sir Hugh is stated to have had two other sons Robert and Bartholomew (*see pedigree in Vincent's North Wales' College of Arms*), both of whom were dead s.p. before 1620, and probably died in infancy. These will make up the full number of 15 assigned to him on the M.I. of Dame Elizabeth Middleton.

Of the foregoing 15 children it is clear from Sir Hugh's will that there were living at his death but three sons—William, Henry and Simon, and four daughters—Jane, Elizabeth, Anne and Hester.

SIR WILLIAM MIDDLETON, eldest surviving son and heir, inherited the baronetcy upon the death of his father Sir Hugh. He was baptized at St. Matthew's, Friday-street, April 10, 1603, and is named in the wills of both his father and mother. He became a burgess of Denbigh in September, 1630, and a capital burgess on June 18, 1647, as "Sir William Middleton, Bart., Governor of Denbigh Castle" (*Archæologia*
