

DECENDANTS OF HENRY MIDDLETON
SECOND SON OF SIR HUGH MIDDLE-
TON, FIRST BARONET.

HENRY MIDDLETON, fifth, but second surviving son, of Sir Hugh, was baptized at St. Matthew's, Friday Street, on the 14th June, 1607. He was admitted to Gray's Inn, 16th May, 1620, and was made a burgess of Denbigh in September, 1630. Was living in 1652, when he is named in the will of his brother, Sir William Middleton, and is thought to have died about the year 1675. He was certainly dead before July, 1678. His wife's name has not been discovered, but he left issue, at least two sons,

1. *William Middleton*. Living in 1678-80. Legatee under the will of his uncle, Simon Middleton of Edmonton. Supposed to have died *s.p.*

2. *Henry Middleton* (see below).

HENRY MIDDLETON, second son. Born about the year 1662; bound apprentice to Robert Andrews, surgeon, in Crutched Friars, London, 17th January, 1676. Legatee under the will of his uncle, Simon Middleton of Edmonton, in 1680. He became an inhabitant of the parish of St. Olave, Hart-street, London, in 1684, where he practised as a surgeon; and is said, in his professional character, to have attended Robert Harley, afterwards Earl of Oxford, when he was stabbed by Guiscard. He is said to have lived to an advanced age, but the date of his death has not been found. He married, first on the 16th May, 1687, at St. Dionis Backchurch, Ann Starkey, of St. Leonard's, Bromley, daughter of Philip Starkey, of London, citizen and cook; secondly Elizabeth, daughter of Joseph Rolfo, of Stepney, silk-throwster.

He had issue—

1. *Starkey Middleton*, eldest son
2. *Henry Middleton* (see below).
3. *Benjamin Middleton*, bapt. 30th April, 1695, supposed to have died *s.p.*
4. *Anne*, died in infancy, 25th June, 1689.
