

STARKEY MIDDLETON, eldest son, born 3 April, 1688, entered Merchant Taylor's School, London, 10 Sept., 1697. Was a surgeon in London. He appears to have been twice married. "Susanna, wife of Mr. Starkey Myddelton, citizen and surgeon 1718," mentioned by Lysons as on a tombstone at St. Leonard's, Bromley, was probably his first wife. His second wife was named Dinah. In his will, which is dated 12 Feb., 1744-5, he desires to be buried in the family vault, at St. Leonard's, Bromley. He died at Bath, probably on a visit there, and was buried in Bath Abbey, 24 June, 1755. By his second wife he had issue

1. *William Middleton*, bapt. at Abingdon, Berks, 20 Feb., 1722-3. Probably died young *went to Do. Cor.?*

2. *Starkey Middleton*, bapt. at Abingdon 16 Sept., 1724, and seems to have been the "Starkey Middleton, esq." who died in the *West Indies* in 1768. (*Gent. Mag.*) In all probability he might have successfully claimed the Baronetcy upon the death of Sir Hugh Middleton in 1757. *P. C.?*

3. *Henry Middleton*, bapt. at Abingdon. Was a medical man in London, and died s. p. Sept. 1759. His death is entered in the *Gentleman's Magazine* of that year under date Sept. 4 as "Dr. Middleton of Cateaton-street." Doubtless the Henry Middleton, M.D. of St. Andrews April 1755, Licentiate College of Physicians 12 April, 1756. (*Vide Munk's Roll of College of Physicians.*)

4. A daughter said to be the "Mrs. Myddelton of Reading" who in 1784 was married to Dr. Jubb, Canon of Christ Church, (*Gentleman's Magazine*) and was living his widow in 1792.

HENRY MIDDLETON, second son of Henry Middleton and Ann Starkey. Baptised 30 July, 1699. Buried at West Ham, Essex, 30th Nov., 1726. His wife's name is not recorded, but he left issue, a daughter, Anna Maria, living in 1792, and then wife of William Grandprece and a son,

STARKEY MIDDLETON, born at West Ham., Essex, and baptized there 3 July, 1719, married at St. Luke's, Old Street, Middlesex, 2 March,
