VII. EZRA AMES, b. at Watervliet Center (now Verdoy), N. Y., June 21, 1804; d. at Big Foot, Wis., Nov. 1, 1861; m. 1826, Zilpah Packard. He studied medicine with his brother-in-law, Dr. James Wade, and attended medical lectures in Albany, N. Y. He practiced his profession in Montgomery, Schoharie and Otsego counties, N. Y., and in 1845 went to Big Foot Prairie, Wis., where, in spite of long-continued ill health, he acquired a large practice. He was one of the members of the convention which framed the original constitution for the state of Wisconsin. His letters to his eastern relatives, many of which have been preserved, give interesting accounts of pioneer life in Wisconsin.
