Both the church and town records of Canton, and old church records of Simsbury, were lost or destroyed between 1828 and 1838, and information was supplied from other sources.

Authorities referred to, as a whole, establish beyond question the lineage of GEORGE H. BARBOUR to be the son of Samuel Thompson Barber and Phebe, daughter of Captain John Beckwith, who served in the Continental Army during the War of the Revolution; *grandson* of William Barber and Mary, daughter of Colonel Isaiah Thompson, who served in the Continental Army and was a member of the "Society of Cincinnati"; *great grandson* of Joel Barber and Mary, his wife, daughter of
