BENJ. FANEUIL HUNT. 1792.

Son of William Hunt and Jane Bethune, of Watertown, Mass., was born Feb. 29, 1792; graduated at Harvard, 1810; for the benefit of his health, removed to Charleston, South Carolina, where he studied law in the office of Caton Simmons, Esq. For nearly forty years he was a successful and very eminent lawyer at the Charleston bar. For many years he was a member of the Legislature of the State. He was Col. of the 18th Regiment of Militia, on that account was always familiarly known as Col. Hunt; he married Susan Barksdale Mathewes, second daughter of Wm. Mathewes, of Charleston; of this marriage there were four children: William Mathewes Hunt, died unmarried; Benj. Faneuil Hunt, married Theresa Hastings, no children; George Bethune Hunt, dead; Jane Bethune Hunt, an invalid from her 17th year. Col. Hunt died in New-
