

- b. Ann Williams*, born 12 Nov., 1786, bap. 18 Jan., 1787, at Guildsfield, mar. at Llansaintffraid, 30 June, 1834, to Robert Wall. By her marriage settlement, dated two days before, a freehold property, Glanvirniew, was vested in trustees (R. Deakin, now deceased, and R. J. Croxon), for her appointment and in default for her separate use, with remainder in case of her death during her husband's life (which took place) for her then heir or coheirs at law. After her death without issue, 23 June, 1854, her husband had no right, no paternal relative has made any claim, but the surviving trustee, Croxon, refused to give possession to her uterine brother until proof of the extinction of her father's family was given. This has hitherto not been done, and the estate, worth more than 2000*l.*, lacks an heir.
- c. John Williams*, died 28 August, 1825, aged 31, unmarried.

By his 2nd wife, Mary Jones, John Evans had issue:—

1. *John Evans*, who had issue:—
 - a. John*, upon whom Henfaes property devolved as heir at law of his uncle Field Evans.
 - b. Elizabeth*, the wife of William Williams.
 - c. Mary*.
 - d. Jane*, the wife of James Martin.
2. *Field Evans*, of Henfaes, near Welshpool, born about 1769, married 11 April, 1800, at St. Chad's, Salop, to Ann Bryan; and died in 1853, without issue and intestate. His realty devolved upon the above John, his nephew, subject to the payment of 2000*l.* under his marriage settlement to his widow, and his personalty was divided among the 7 families of his surviving brothers and sisters. The widow presented to one of her executors, Morris C. Jones, hereafter mentioned, eleven silver buttons which had belonged to his great grandfather, Thomas Evans, who died in 1766. Field Evans used sometimes to boast that he could trace the family to Prince Llewellyn.
3. *William Evans*, who had issue:—
 - a. John*.
 - b. Jane*, the wife of Charles Pugh.
 - c. Sarah*, the wife of Richard Morris.
4. *Edward*, dead in 1853.
5. *Arthur*, dead in 1853.
6. *Elizabeth*, who married Evan Jones, of the Park, Guildsfield, alive in 1853.
