+ADRIANNA PETRONELLA,⁵ b. Mar. 22, 1749; m. Jan van Kruyne. Catharina Bernardina,⁵ b. 1753; d. young.

ADRIANNA PETRONELLA DE BEAUFORT,⁵ (Peter Bernard,⁴ Lieven Ferdinand,³ Bernard Laurens,² Peter,¹) dau. of the above, born March 22, 1749, at Middleburg, Holland. She married JAN VAN KRUYNE. (See below.) In one account she is called Jeanne Adrienne, and in another Johanna Petronella.

VAN KRUYNE FAMILY.

JEAN or JAN VAN KRUYNE,⁵ born at Brielle; married ADRIANNA PETRONELLA DE BEAUFORT. (See above.) He was Rear Admiral under the orders of the Board of Admiralty in Zeeland, Holland, and commanded the warship Saint Martinsdyk, protecting the East India trade, from April 2nd, to October 9th 1772. He died in 1787, at Bergen-op-Zoom, Holland.
