teen hundred men, commanded by Brigadier Carroll, came to Inniskean with a design to have that place and some other small garrisons near it, as steps to a further advance upon our frontier, but the assailants were driven off by Col. Ogieby. In the following month, Brigadier Francis Carroll was stationed at Ross, and acting as Governor and commander of his Majesty's army, in the counties of Kerry and Cork." He was constituted Colonel of the Queen's dismounted dragoons, on the formation of the Irish brigades in France, at the head of which he fell in the battle of Marsiglia, Italy, Oct., 1698. He was called Turenne O'Carroll, after his illustrious god-father, Turenne. He was from Dublin, Ireland.

Daniel O'Carroll was a Lieutenant Colonel in 1698, and "Brigadier des Armes en 1705." He was knighted by the King of Spain in the military order of St. Jago, but became disgusted and left Spain. He entered Queen Anne's army and was made a colonel of a horse regiment, and again knighted. He married Elizabeth Jarvis, daughter of Sir Thomas Jarvis, (of the county of Southampton,) by his first wife, Elizabeth, who was a daughter of Gilbert Clark, of Chyliothe, in Derbyshire.

It is probable that Mary Carroll was descended from either the Francis or Daniel above mentioned, with a possibility of Thomas, No. 129.
