6. **Deed.**—Joseph R. Whitaker from George Corson and Wife. Deed dated September 21, 1894. Recorded in Q. 7, page 116. A small farm situated in East Dover Hundred, on road leading from Dover to Leipsic, adjoining lands of Stayton Walton, and other lands of said Joseph R. Whitaker deceased, containing 11 acres and 42 square perches, appraised at 350 00
7. **Deed.**—Joseph R. Whitaker from James C. Robinson, Sheriff of Kent County. Two Deeds, one dated November 1, 1886, and recorded in X. 6, 26, and the other dated May 10, 1887, and recorded in Y. 6, 46. Together they convey the property known as the "Chambers Cannery," situate on the south side of Lockerman Street, in the town of Dover, at the Railroad Station, the lot having a front on said Lockerman Street of 120 feet and running back to North Street. The Deed first mentioned included the boiler, engine and fixtures and machinery connected with said "Cannery," and they are still used in connection with the "Cannery." Appraised at 3,600 00
8. **Deed.** Joseph R. Whitaker from James C. Robinson, Sheriff of Kent County. Deed dated May 10, 1887, in Y. 6, 46. A lot 50 by 155½ feet on West side of Main or State Street in said Town of Dover, 100 feet from Clara Street, and is designated as lot No. 3 on Bradford's addition to Silver Lake City. Appraised at 250 00
9. **Deed.** Joseph R. Whitaker from Wilson L. Cannon and wife. Deed dated November 14, 1882.
