21 April 1494. Will of William Bysse of Saperton [co. Glouc.], senior. To be buried within the parish church of Saperton—son William Bysse—wife Margery. (13 Vox.)

10 Oct. 1507. Nicholas Bysse of New Sarum. To be buried in the burial-ground of the parish church of St. Thomas in New Sarum—unmarried daughter Dionysia—Thomas Browne my apprentice. Wife Alice, ext'x. Proved 2 Dec. 1507. (31 Adeane.)

18 Jan. 1519. Will of Philip Bysse. To be buried in the parish church of Stoke St. Michael [co. Somerset]—to Richard Bisse—to Joan my wife—to James Bisse “nepoti meo”—to John my son sen^r. Said James and John ex'ors. Proved 14 May 1520 by John Bisse and James Bisse, the ex'ors. (26 Ayloff.)

1557. [No further date.] “I Jone Bysse of Trestocke in the countie of Somersett, widowe.” To be buried in Trestocke churchyard—son Philip Bysse—daughter Denyse “and to Jone”—“to John”—to James Bysse—to Philip Bysse—son James ex'or—John Willes and “Water Bothe” overseers. Proved 8 Nov. 1558. (67 Noodes.)

20 Nov. 1559. “I Richarde bysse of the parrishe of Publo in the countie of Somerset.” Lease of Peglege—wife Frances—children, some or all under 21—eldest son—brother John Bysse and brother-in-law John Lombowe, two of the overseers. Proved 27 May 1560 for Frances, the relict. (33 Mellershe.)

20 Oct. 1565. “I John Bisse of Pensforde in the countie of Somersett gentleman.” Daughter Cicely—daughter Johan, unmarried—to sons William Bysse and Richard Bisse £20 apiece “when they enter in the fferme of Peglynche”—son Laurence, under 21—Philip Bisse, son of Philip Bisse my son, dec^d, when 21—wife Margaret—daughter Agnes, unmarried—daughter Maud—to son Thomas the 100 marks promised him at his marriage—son John Bisse, ex'or—John Bisse of Stoke-layne, clothier, an overseer. Codicil, 4 Nov. 1565. Adm'on with will and codicil 19 Oct. 1566 to John Bisse, jun^r, as though the deceased had died intestate, he, the said John Bisse, jun^r, having renounced executorship. (26 Crymes.)

3 April 1567. James Bisse of “stooke Michell,” co. Somerset, Esq. To be buried in the chapel of “Stooke Saincte Michaell aforesaide” on the left side of grandfather and father—sister Agnes Style—sister Johan Heller—brother Philip—sister Agnes Starre—children of sister Alice Clarke—nephew James Bisse, eldest son of brother John—said John living—nephew Philip Bysse of Corsecombe—niece Anne, unmarried—brother John Bisse, ex'or. Witnesses, “phillip bysse p'sone of the p'ishe church of Batcombe and Richard Bysse his father.” Proved 19 Aug. 1569. (17 Sheffield.)
