

28 July 1636. Adm'on to Samuel Bisse, late of Wells, co. Somerset, widower, dec<sup>d</sup>, granted to George Bisse, the son. (Fo. 9.)

7 April 1640. James Bisse of Batcombe, Esq. Wife Mary. Proved 15 May 1640 by Mary, the relict and ext'x. (59 Coventry.)

4 May 1640. Adm'on to Strowde Bisse, late of Croscombe, co. Somerset, dec<sup>d</sup>, granted to Frances, the relict. (Fo. 127.)

8 Oct. 1641. "I Robert Bisse of Shepton Mallett in the Countie of Som'ss', clothier." "Vnto the poore of the p'ish of Croscombe where I was borne" 20s.—"vnto my sonne James Bisse" £350—"vnto my daughter Abigall Bisse" £300—"vnto my sonne Robert Bisse" £300—"vnto my sonne William Bisse" £300—"vnto my brother James Bisse of Westcombe" £5 "and my best suite of clothes" —wife, residuary legatee and sole ext'x—"my brother-in-law M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Strode of Bowlease" and my "owne brother M<sup>r</sup> James Bisse, the Rector of Croscombe," overseers, to whom 20s. apiece—said sons William and Robert under 21. Proved at Oxford 26 Jan. 1643-4 by Hester Bisse, the relict, etc. *Original will.*

Sister Duphfill, and her three children under 21—"brother William, Thomas, Richard, and Edward Sturt," all under 21—brother William Cutfold's three children, under 21—uncle Hugh Penfold's children—Margery Sturt, wife of John Sturt—godson John Duphfill—brother William Cutfold of Flaunceham par. Phelsham, ex'or—John Sturt, overseer. Not dated. Proved 22 Jan. 1645-6 by William Cutfold, the ex'or. (1 Twisse.)

28 Feb. 1643. James Bisse of Foxcott, co. Somerset, Esq. To be buried in Batcombe church—grandchild Elizabeth Scudamore, wife of Thomas Scudamore of White Oxe Meade—daughter Eleanor Chicke of Batcombe—George Scudamore, son of said Elizabeth—grandchild Joanna Orange—testator formerly lived at Batcombe—daughter Elizabeth Orange—grandchildren John Orange, Humphrey Orange, Francis Orange, and William Orange—daughter-in-law Mary Bysse—friends Upton Bisse of Almesford, clerk, and Richard Hodson of Ca'marton, clerk, overseers—John Bysse, a witness. Proved 10 Nov. 1646 by William Orange, the grandchild and ex'or. (171 Twisse.)
