

13 March 1723-4. Adm'on to Robert Bisse, late of Coulston, co. Wilts, dec^d, granted to Eleanor Bisse, widow, the relict.

25 May 1733. William Bisse of St Helen's, London, gent. Children of brother Thomas Bisse, dec^d—brother John Bisse and his children—wife Ellen, ext'x. Witnesses, "James Perchard, Reb: Martin, Tho: Martin." Proved 12 June 1736 by said ext'x. (125 Derby.)


12 Dec. 1735. Adm'on to Elizabeth Bisse, late of Pidlinch, co. Dorset, widow, dec^d, granted to Robert Merefield, a creditor, *Mary Gapper* (or Gopper), *widow*, the sister and only next of kin renouncing. [The italic portion of this entry crossed through.]

26 July 1736. James Bisse of St Clement Danes, co. Midd^x, Esq., son of James Bisse of Battcombe, co. Somerset, Esq., dec^d. Everything to "Mary the Daughter of Philip Parsons of Batcombe aforesaid, Hosier, formerly married or reputed to be married to William Haynes, Surgeon, and who afterwards lived with me and goes now by my name," and she ext'x. Proved 19 Aug. 1736 by Mary Parsons otherwise Haynes, the ext'x. (171 Derby.)

26 Oct. 1737. Jane Bisse of Christ Church, London, spinster. To be buried at Codicot, co. Herts—sister Anne Bisse—niece Anna Maria—goddau^r Jane Bisse—niece Elizabeth Bisse—nephew George Bisse—niece Rebecca Bisse—brother D^r James Bisse—sister Rebecca Perriman—brother Thomas Chase—sister Mary Chase—nephew Edward Chase—niece Jane Bisse—said brother D^r James, ex'or. Codicil. Dated 12 March 1743. Niece Anna Maria Bisse, now dec^d—nephew Robert Rossiter, one of the sons of M^r Hugh Rossiter, said Hugh living—Thomas Chase Rossiter, eldest son of said Hugh. Said will and codicil proved 22 Nov. 1744 by James Bisse, Esq., the ex'or. On 14 March 1749-50 adm'on of goods, etc., unadministered by said ex'or granted to George Poyner Bisse, Esq., the said James adm'or. Anne Rossiter, wife of said Hugh is mentioned in said will as living. (249 Anstis.)

2 Feb. 1740-1. William Biss of Shoemaker Row, London, Corporal on board "the Tiger man-of-war." Sons William Biss, John Biss, Abraham Biss, and Stephen Biss—said son William, ex'or. Proved 25 May 1743 by said ex'or. (152 Boycott.)

30 May 1741. Stephen Bisse of Wimbleton, co. Surry. To be buried in Lothbury Church near deceased wife—testator sometime Agent for Victualling at Lisbon—sister Elizabeth Walter and her son Edward and daughter Mary—sister Rebecca Rowe and her son William and daughter Mary—sister Jane Shute and her son Stephen—sister Eleanor Richards—cousins George Bray, Edward Bray, Elizabeth Bray, Mary
