

William Bisse, ex'ors. Proved (with a codicil dated 16 Dec. 1750) 1 July 1752 by said ex'ors. (180 Bettesworth.)

13 April 1752. Adm'on to Samuel Biss, late of Kensington, co. Midd^x, dec^d, granted to Mary Biss, widow, the relict.

10 Sept. 1753. Adm'on to Rebecca Rowe, formerly Bisse, late of Crediton, co. Devon, dec^d, granted to Laurence Rowe, the husband.

19 Feb. 1754. Sarah Bisse, wife of Thomas Bisse of Warwick Court in Warwick Lane, London, gent. Indentures of lease and release, dated respectively on or about 16 and 17 March 1753, the release being tripartite and between the said Thomas Bisse of first part, me the said Sarah, by the name and description of Sarah Peck of St Mary's [-at-] Hill, London, widow, of second part, etc., in consideration of a marriage then intended and since had and solemnized between the said Thomas and me, relating to property in Garwicke and Heckington, co. Lincoln—testatrix pregnant. Proved 3 Jan. 1757 by said Thomas Bisse, the husband, etc. (2 Herring.)

8 Sept. 1755. Limited Administration. Property in par. St John the Baptist, Hereford, became vested in Alice Russell, widow, and Sarah Russell, spinster, her daughter; and the said Alice died, leaving behind her Judith, wife of William Passey, and the said Sarah, late wife of Charles Biss, her daughters and only children, leaving also a will. Indenture, dated 25 May 1743, between William Weaver of first part, the said William Passey of second part, the said Charles Biss of third part, and Thomas Biss, by the name and addition of Rev^d Thomas Biss of All Souls College, Oxford, of fourth part—said Charles Biss since dead, intestate (adm'on to him granted to James Woodhouse), and said Thomas Biss has since also died intestate and a bachelor at All Souls College—adm'on to said Rev^d Thomas, limited as to his interest in the premises in Hereford, granted 8 Sept. 1755 to Richard Summers on behalfe of the said James Woodhouse.

5 Jan. 1772. George Poyner Bisse, late of Coddicot Bury, co. Herts, Esq. Niece Anna Maria Church—M^r William Church, late of Snow Hill, London, apothecary—sister Jane Church, widow—sister Rebecca Page, widow—nephew George Bisse Church, under 25. No other relations mentioned. Proved 22 Jan. 1772 by John Norton, the sole ex'or. (5 Taverner.) In the Probate Act book testator is described as formerly of Coddicot Bury, co. Herts, but late of New Windsor, co. Berks.

23 June 1827. Rev^d Thomas Bisse of Portnall Park, par. Egham, co. Surry, clerk. Wife Charlotte—son Thomas Chaloner Bisse—son William Chaloner Bisse—will of Mrs. Lydia Chaloner referred to. Proved 1 Dec. 1828 by Thomas Chaloner Bisse, Esq., the son. (686 Sutton.)

8 Nov. 1610. Adm'on to Laurence Bisse, late of Preston, par. Ferring, co. Sussex, dec^d, granted to John Sheppard alias Gibbs, a creditor.
