

23 Oct. 1529. William Longe of Freshford [co. Somerset], clothier. Wife Alice buried in church there—testator born at Sem'ngton and there baptized—sister Margaret Barley—daughter Mary Long—son Thomas Long, under 21—wife Isabel and her children—brother little John Longe—"to Thomas Horton the yonger and Joane Byse of Publey my wife's brother," "the whiche said Thomas Horton and John Byse of Publey I make my overseers"—said wife Isabel, ext'x. Proved 7 Jan. 1529-30 by said ext'x. (14 Jankyn.)

10 Jan. 1571-2. "I John Cutt of bristowe, Merchaunte and late Maio^r there." To be buried in the church of St. Werbergh in Bristol—wife Johan—son William Cutt—son Nicholas Cutt—son Mathew Cutt, under 21—daughter Bridget, unmarried—brother-in-law John Riche—son-in-law John Byse—son-in-law Robert Sandforde—brother-in-law Thomas Keleke—"to John Byse's childrenne." Proved 10 June 1575 for said wife, the sole ext'x. (24 Pickering.)

20 Aug. 1592. William Strowde of Shepton Mallett, dio. Bath and Wells. Son Jeffery Strowde—son William Strowde—son George Strowde—daughter Mary Strowde—testator thinks his wife pregnant—mother Alice Strowde—brother Edward Strowde—sister Anne Allambridge—brother Thomas Strowde—cousin Thomas Cowarde—cousin William Bisse—wife Elizabeth, ext'x. Proved 1 Sept. 1592 for said ext'x. (70 Harrington.)

11 June 1595. Ann Trewman of Frampton Cottrell, co. Gloucester, widow. Grandchildren Trewman—sister Joan Bisse, wife of Thomas Bisse—brother-in-law Thomas Bisse—Ann Bisse, daughter of said Thomas, Elizabeth Bisse, daughter of same, and Arthur Bisse, Thomas Bisse, and Sarah, children of same—deceased husband Edward Trewman. Proved 7 Nov. 1595. (68 Scott.)

1 April 1603. Dame Joan Younge of the city of Bristol, widow. "To Andrew Bisse my servaunt tenn pounds." Proved (with a codicil dated 16 May 1603) 7 Feb. 1603-4. (25 Harte.)

5 June 1603. Elizabeth Martyn of Heath House in Rodden, co. Som^t, but at Boyton, co. Wilts, widow. To Samuel Byse, son of Gilbert Byse—to Susan Bennet, wife of John Bennet, and to Alice Byse her sister. Said John Bennet had issue. Proved 3 Feb. 1614-5. (11 Rudd.)

16 Feb. 1605-6. Anne Bridgman of Badminton Magna, co. Gloucester, widow. Daughter Judith Bisse—Judith Bisse, daughter of Edward Bisse, my son-in-law, under 18, and her two sisters, Joane Bisse and Grace Bisse, under same age—Judith Bisse, wife of said Edward, and Florence Bisse, daughter of the same—children of brother Sir Robert Younge—estate of mother, Lady Younge, unadministered by brother, M^r Nicholas Strangwaies, her ex'or, dec^d—etc., etc. Proved 8 July 1606. On 10 Nov. 1612 adm'on of goods, etc., unadministered by the ex'or, now dec^d, granted to Judith Byse (wife of Edward Byse), the daughter. (59 Stafford.)

1607. Peter Blackborowe. William Byse an overseer and a witness. Not dated. Proved 8 Aug. 1607. (72 Huddleston.)

2 Nov. 1607. John Serrey [of Stokelane, co. Som^t]. Brothers-in-law James Bisse and Robert Russe the elder—son James—daughter Elizabeth—daughter Judith. Proved 3 Feb. 1607-8 by Mary Serrey, the relict and ext'x. (17 Windebank.)
