Proved 2 Sept. 1626 by said ext'x. (109 Hele.)

4 June 1627. "I John Casberd of Eastherington within the parish of S<sup>t</sup> Cutbert in Wells in the Countie of Som'ss<sup>t</sup>, Yeoman." Wife Judith, ext'x—children mentioned in general terms. Proved 29 Sept. 1627 by said ext'x. (87 Skinner.)

11 March 1628. "I Thomas Hawker of Spartgrove within the Parrish of Battecombe in the county of Som'ss<sup>t</sup>, Esquier." Daughter Elizabeth Bisse, wife of Edward Bisse, the younger, of Spartgrove aforesaid, Esq.—daughter Ann Blake, wife of William Blake of Kensington, co. Midd<sup>x</sup>, Esq.—daughter Lady Hawker—Edward Bisse, the elder, of Spartgrove, Esq.—grandchild Ann Blake, daughter of said William Blake, Esq.—said daughter Lady Hawker, ext'x—wife, Lady, and brother-in-law John Philoll, ext'x and ex'or in trust. Proved 24 June 1636 by Lady Hawker, the relict, and John Filoll, power reserved to Lady Hawker, the daughter. (75 Pile.)

14 Feb. 1634-5. Christian Challenor of New Windsor, co. Berks, widow. "To my cossen Bisse his wife"—"to my goddaughter Christian Bisse." Proved 27 April 1637. (55 Goare.)

26 Aug. 1635. Codicil of George Mompesson of Corton, co. Wilts, Esq., made about 26 Aug. 1635. Son Henry—son George, dec<sup>d</sup>—daughter Frances—daughter Helen—daughter Rachel—wife, with child. Proved 23 June 1637 by Helen Mompesson, the relict, and confirmed by sentence which follows. (99 Goare.) [From said sentence it appears that the said George's will was dated 13 May 1633, but this is not registered. The Probate Act book states that the said will was proved 2 Dec. 1635 by Helen Mompesson, the relict, and that it was confirmed by sentence in 1637.]

15 Oct. 1636. John Filloll of Spartgrove, co. Somerset, gent. Cousin John Filloll, son of brother William, dec<sup>d</sup>—"cossen John Bisse sonne to my brother-in-lawe Mr James Bisse of Croscoms"—three sisters—cousins Grace Fitzjames and Joan Fitzjames—nieces, the other three daughters of my sister Hawker—sister's daughter Thomasin Maye—cousin Edward Bisse, the younger, ex'or. Edward Bisse, sen<sup>r</sup>, a witness. Proved 2 Feb. 1636-7 by Edward Bisse, jun<sup>r</sup>, the ex'or, who was sworn before Mr James Bisse, clerk. (17 Goare.)

13 April 1641. Edward Orange of Foscott, co. Somerset. Wife—son William—sons Humphrey and Francis—daughter Mary, unmarried—daughter Bull—daughter Johanna—son John—deceased father—daughter Edith Orange, dec<sup>d</sup>, made a will—sister Cheeke—daughter Elizabeth Bull—grandchild William Bull and grandchild and godson Edward Bull—father Mr James Bysse—son Bull—nephew Mr Edward Nicholls. Published 19 May 1641. Laurence Bull a witness to said will and to the codicil. Proved (with a codicil dated 23 June 1641) 3 Feb. 1641-2 by Elizabeth Orange, the relict. (22 Campbell.)
