17 Feb. 1747. Richard Riland, Rector of Sutton Coldfield, co. Warwick. Elder son Richard Bisse—younger son John—nephew Charles Riland, son of brother M<sup>r</sup> John Riland of Sutton Coldfield aforesaid—wife Mary—mother-in-law M<sup>rs</sup> Elizabeth Owstey, wife to Rev. M<sup>r</sup> John Owstey of Whitelackington, co. Som<sup>ts</sup>. Proved (with 1<sup>st</sup> cod. dat. 5 Feb. 1749, and 2<sup>nd</sup> ditto 14 March 1752) 3 Sept. 1765 by Mary Riland, the relict and ext<sup>x</sup>. (345 Rushworth.)

2 June 1750. Bisse Richards of Wimbledon, co. Surry, Esq. Everything to trustees for the benefit of mother, Eleanor Richards. Adm<sup>on</sup>, with will annexed, of goods, etc., of Bisse Richards, bachelor, dec<sup>d</sup>, granted to Eleanor Richards, widow, the mother and next of kin, 15 Jan. 1756. (20 Glazier.)

8 Sept. 1755. Limited administration to Rev<sup>d</sup> Thomas Biss. The bondsmen were Richard Summers of the city of Hereford, yeoman, John Hawkins of St. Faith's, London, druggist, and John Ravenhill of St. John the Baptist, Hereford, mercer.

5 Jan. 1756. Eleanor Richards of Wimbledon, co. Surry, widow. Testatrix refers to the will of her deceased son Bisse Richards, Esq. First codicil, dated 8 Feb. 1756: To Joseph Richards of Lambeth, co. Surry, glassmaker—nephew George Bray—niece Mary Ryland and her husband—niece Mary Waters otherwise Bennett—niece Mary Rowe—niece Margaret Sanderson—niece Mary Vigers—nephew Stephen Shute—nephew William Rowe. Second codicil, dated 5 April 1756. Said will and codicils proved 18 May 1756. (149 Glazier.)

29 Aug. 1759. Elizabeth Rebotier, wife of Elias Rebotier of Axbridge, co. Som<sup>ts</sup>, clerk. Brother-in-law Edward Jones of the city of Bristol, ironmonger—Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas Homfray of said city, ironmonger, and Elizabeth, wife of the said Thomas—sister Ellen Chorley, spinster—Ann, wife of said Edward Jones—said Edward, sole ex<sup>or</sup>. Adm<sup>on</sup>, with the will annexed, of the goods, etc., of Elizabeth Rebotier, late of Axbridge, co. Som<sup>ts</sup>, widow, dec<sup>d</sup>, was granted 28 June 1766 to Elizabeth Homfray (wife of Thomas Homfray), the niece of the said dec<sup>d</sup> and residuary legatee, substituted in the said will; Edward Jones, the ex<sup>or</sup> and residuary legatee in trust, having renounced; Elias Rebotier, the husband of the said dec<sup>d</sup>, etc., having died in her lifetime; and Ellen Chorley, spinster, the sister and only next of kin, having also renounced.

25 Nov. 1765. Elias Rebotier of Axbridge, co. Som<sup>ts</sup>, clerk. Granddaughter Elizabeth Speed—brother David Rebotier of Stoke Newington, co. Midd<sup>x</sup>, merchant, living 19 May 1749—wife Elizabeth—granddaughter Elizabeth Speed of Croscomb in said co. Som<sup>ts</sup>, spinster, under 21—nephew Charles Rebotier of Stoke Newington aforesaid—to said wife (inter alia) “a pair of silver candlesticks and snuffers with mine and the Bisses' arms on them”—Mary Dunster of Axbridge, widow, sister of testator's present wife, was a benefactor by will to the poor of that parish. Proved 21 Jan. 1766 by Elizabeth Rebotier, the relict and sole ext<sup>x</sup>. (82 Tyndall.)
