

*Richard Cambray*, of Sherborne, yeoman. Dated 29 Jan. 1709. *Inter alia* Son-in-law Robert Cambray, 2s. 6d. Grandson, Robert Cambray, £15. Granddaughter Elinor Cambray, £8. Three sons of son Thomas, deceased—Thomas £10, Robert £8, Richard £5, "if ever he shall come to demand it." Proved in Gloucester, 27 April 1711.

*Thomas Cambray*, of Great Rissington, yeoman. Dated 5 Dec. 1739. "Cousin" Mary, wife of William Newman, of Sherborne, £20. "Cousin" William Cambray, of Lechlade, £20. "Cousin" Margaret, wife of Henry Clark, of Clanfield, £20. "Cousin" Eleanor, wife of Thomas Ward, of Sherborne, 20s. a year for life. "Cousin" Thomas Smith, of Hathrop, £20. "Cousin" Richard Cambray, £10. "Cousin" Eleanor Bridges, 2s. 6d. "Cousin" Robert, son of Robert Cambray, of this parish, 2s. 6d. "Cousin" Sarah, wife of Giles Cripps, of Hathrop, £10. "Cousin" Robert Cambray, of Fairford, "One yard land and three-quarters of a yard land both of life land," after the decease of my wife. Wife, Sarah, house, land, &c., for life, with remainder to "cousin" Thomas, son of Robert Cambray, of this parish, Executor. His father to be Trustee till he attains 21. Proved in Gloucester, 23 July 1741.

NOTE.—Throughout this will "cousin" is used for relative.

*Robert Cambray*, the younger, of Broad Rissington. Dated 9 Oct. 1757. Other half of my estate in Broad Rissington, now in jointure to my wife Elizabeth, to said wife for life, with remainder to brother Thomas, subject to payment of £10 to my father for life. Leasehold property to wife for life, with remainder to nephew George Cambray, subject to payment of £6 to my father. Niece Mary Cripps £50 at 30. Nephew George Cambray £50 after wife's death. Brother Richard and his wife after him 50s. a year six years after my decease. Brother Richard, £50. Wife, household goods. Brothers Thomas and Richard, wearing apparel. "My watch, silver shoe and knee buckles to be equally divided between them." Niece Mary Cripps, further sum of £50 a year after wife's decease, whom failing, Brother Richard. Residue to wife, executrix. Proved in Gloucester, 16 Nov. 1757.

*Robert Cambray*, of Great Rissington. Dated 20 April 1772. Granddaughter Mary Cripps all his lands and tenements in Great Rissington, subject to an annuity of £3 a year to his granddaughter Sarah Cambray. The third of his personalty to the above Sarah. Residue to Mary Cripps, executrix. Proved in Gloucester, 18 June 1772.
