ARMS OF BAINBRIGGE.—*Argent, a fesse embattled between three battle-axes sable.*  
 CREST.—*A goat sable, horned and unguled argent, round his neck a collar of the same, standing on a hill vert.*

John Baynbrigge of Wheatley, co. York. Alicia.  
 Called in 'Visitation of Leicestershire, 1619,' Johannes Baynbrig del North.

William Robinson, descended out of the North.

ARMS.—*Vert, on a chevron between three stags statant or as many trefoils slipped gules, in chief a crescent for difference.*

Modwyn=William Bainbrig of Lockington=Elizabeth, dau. of Edward  
 Wolfhide. aforesaid. Purchased the Manor Charde, one of the Exchequer  
 1st wife. of Lockington 1576. High Sheriff at Westminster. Mar. 1571.  
 Mar. 24 co. Leicester 1555. Died 22 April Died 17 April 1624, aged 73.

 William Robinson, D.D., Archdeacon of Nottingham; Prebendary of York, St. David's, and Westminster; Rector of Long Whatton, co. Leicester, and Bingham, co. Nottingham.

William Laud, D.D., Dean of the Cathedral Church of Gloucester. Bishop of St. David's 1621, of Bath and Wells 1626, and of London 1628; Archbishop of Canterbury 1633. Born at Reading 1573. Executed on Tower Hill 10 Jan. 1645.

2. Henry Robinson, Clerk, M.A., Rector of Long Whatton aforesaid. Bur. at Lockington. M.I.  
 Anne, dau. of Thomas and Agnes Bainbrige. Bur. at Lockington. M.I.

1. Sir John Robinson, Bart., Lord Mayor of London, and nephew of Archbishop Laud. Died 1697.  
 Anne, dau. of Sir George Whitmore, Knt., of Barnes, co. Surrey.
