

William Lemon, Bart., Furley, Lubbock, and Co., and removed to 11 Mansion House Street. In 1780 the firm was Sir William Lemon, Bart., Furley, Lubbock, Wilyams, and Co., the partners being Sir William Lemon, Bart., John Furley, John Lubbock, and Humphrey Wilyams; John Alders Clarke being admitted partner 1 January 1781, but his name did not appear in the firm until 1801.

On 25 March 1785 Sir William Lemon retired, and William Bosanquet was admitted, the name of the firm being for a short time Furley, Lubbock, Bosanquet, and Co., Mr. Wilyams having retired or deceased. In April 1785 Mr. Furley retired, and Mr. Edward Forster was admitted, the partners being Mr. Edward Forster, Mr. John Lubbock, Mr. William Bosanquet, and Mr. John Alders Clarke, under the title of Forster, Lubbock, Bosanquet, and Co.

Subsequently to June 1800, but before 1801, Mr. Bosanquet retired or deceased, as the firm then was Forster, Lubbocks, Forster, and Clarke, John Lubbock's nephew John William, and Edward Forster, jun., having been admitted. Mr. Forster, sen., died 20 April 1812. In 1814 we find the firm Sir John Lubbock, Lubbock, Forster, Clarke, and Co. Sir John dying 24 February 1816, the name became Sir John William Lubbock, Forster, Clarke, and Co.
