The residue of all my goods not above bequeathed I give and bequeath into the hands of my executors to carry out my funeral and do other works of piety as they may best see fit to please God and advance the health of my soul. I ordain, make, and constitute Robert Lubbok and Thomas Lubbok my sons executors of this my testament. Robert Lobuk died A.D. 1493, leaving issue by his wife Cecilie, who died A.D. 1494, three sons and one daughter:—
