


THOMAS LUBBOCK (son of Richard, *vide supra*, p. 15), of North Walsham, Cordener. The facsimile is taken from the



beginning of his will. Married Johanna . . . , who survived him, and married secondly John Briggs, before 1565, when she surrendered a piece of land in the manor of North Walsham, formerly belonging to her late husband Thomas Lubbock, to her son Nicholas Lubbock and his wife Katherine. Thomas Lubbock was mentioned in the will of his uncle Robert A.D. 1506; his will, dated 18 June 1554, proved 11 July same year, *Norfolk Archdeaconry*, 1553—55, fo. 289, is holograph but unsigned, although testified "these being witnesses." The first witness is the vicar of the parish. He left his houses and lands in North Walsham to his wife Joan for life, and then to his son. Bequests to the high altar and repair of the Church of North Walsham, and to the poor of North Walsham at his burial, which he directs to be in North Walsham churchyard. He died A.D. 1554, leaving issue one son and one daughter:—

(1) Nicholas (of whom see below, p. 17).

(1) Alice, mentioned in her father's will A.D. 1554; mar. Thomas Blake, by whom she had a daughter Elizabeth.
