17 January 1700-1; B.D. 1721, M.A. 1725, B.D. 1734, Fellow of Caius College, Cambridge; presented by Caius College, 11 February 1731-2, to livings of Bincombe and Obourne, co. Dorset, which he exchanged 1738 for Rectory of Lamas and Little Hautbois; was also Vicar of Scottow and of Stalham, all co. Norfolk; married 26 October 1742, at Paston, Norfolk (marriage licence), Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas Cooper, Esq., of North Walsham, High Sheriff of Norfolk 1731 (and of Anne his wife). She married, 2nd, 21 February 1759, at Lamas, William Pepper, of St. Clement's Parish, Norwich, and was buried at North Walsham 13 March 1764, æt. 45. The Rev. William Lubbock appears to have made his first purchase of property at Lamas 22 December 1738. His will, dated 11 June 1752, proved 1 June 1754, mentions his various properties at North Walsham, Calthorpe, Wickmere, Felmingham, and Suffield. Died 20 April 1754; buried at
