

merchant in the City of London; born 27 December 1773, bapt. at Lamas 26 August 1774; educated at Charter House; married at the Collegiate Church at Manchester, 1 August 1799, Mary, daughter of James Entwistle, Esq., of Rusholme, co. Lancaster. She died at High Elms, and was buried at St. James's Church, Piccadilly, 9 January 1845, æt. 66. He represented Leominster in Parliament on the resignation of his uncle 1812—1820; resided at 19 Duke Street, Westminster, until the death of his uncle, when he removed to 23 St. James's Place; he purchased the estate of High Elms, then only 270 acres, of James Edge, Esq., in March 1808; he died at St. James's Place 22 October 1840, and was buried at St. James's Church, Piccadilly (where is monumental inscription), leaving issue an only son,
