

Margaret's, Westminster, 19 May 1803; was educated at Eton; B.A. Trin. Coll. Camb. 1825, M.A. 1833; married 29 June 1833 Harriet, youngest daughter of Lieut.-Col. George Hotham, of York, by his wife Caroline. She died 12 February 1873; buried at Down, co. Kent. Sir John William was a distinguished mathematician and astronomer; his works on the Moon and on the Tides being not only of scientific interest, but of great practical importance; resided at 29 Eaton Place until the death of his father, when he removed to 23 St. James's Place; he sold the North Walsham property and a portion of Lamas in 1841, when he added largely to the High Elms estate, and built the present mansion 1844, having pulled down the former house; he died at High Elms 21 June 1865, and was buried at Down, leaving issue eight sons and three daughters:—

- (1) Right Hon. Sir John Lubbock of Lamas and High Elms, Bart., born at 22 Eaton Place, London, 30 April 1834; F.R.S., D.C.L. Oxford, LL.D. Camb., Edin., and Dub., D.L. for Kent and City of London; M.P. for Maidstone from 1870 till 1880, M.P. for University of London since June 1880; was Vice-Chancellor of that University 1874—1880; a banker in the City of London. Married, 1st, at Rostherne, co. Chester, 10 April 1856, Ellen Frances, only
