

23. **JOHN SUTLIFF**,<sup>5</sup> Rachel,<sup>4</sup> John Rhodes,<sup>3</sup> spent his active life as locomotive engineer New York Central Railroad, Married in 1861 in Syracuse. Wife proving unfaithful they soon separated. Highly respected and esteemed. Died at his sister Ellen's (Cook), Oriskany, 1864. No issue.

24. **HESTER ANNE SUTLIFF**,<sup>6</sup> Rachel,<sup>4</sup> John,<sup>3</sup> June 4, 1840, married William Zimmerman of Waterloo. He died by accident 1879. She is invalided by paralysis. He was born in Russian Pomerania in 1816. Machinist for years in factories at Waterloo, N. Y. Was in California in 1850-'53. Went to Edgerton, Wis.; was on first railway train to that place. With his California gold bought farm of John Lambert; increased farm to 675 acres. He was a Lutheran. At Edgerton, Episcopalian, a Republican, founder of Oddfellow lodge at Edgerton, F. & A. M. Hester to Order of Rebecca.

85. **FRANCES ELLEN ZIMMERMAN**.<sup>6</sup> At Edgerton, Wis., September, 1864, married Martin Van Buren Tackels, born Romeo, Mich, 1840. December 1, 1863, he enlisted in Quartermaster's department, Wisconsin Volunteers. 1864 on recruiting service in Wisconsin. September, 1864, took 100 men to Nashville, Tenn.; December 1, 1864, made captain. Served at battle of Nashville. Discharged June 2, 1865. August, 1865, with wagon, mules, sheep and cows drove to Minnesota. Run thresher in 1866-'67. Took up homestead 1866 after Indian massacre in Watonwan County—wild prairie forty miles from market—plenty of deer, foxes, etc. During 1871-'72 and '73 they lived at her father's. Grasshoppers destroyed crops three years, hail one year. Bought 80 acres more in 1873. Retired 1891 and settled in Madelia, Minn. Mr. and Mrs. Tackles, with Lamont and Grace, members of Christian church. Republican. I. O. O. F.
