

## HISTORY.

---

**T**HE first record of the name of Guild in America appears to have been made in the town of Dedham, in Massachusetts, where two brothers and a sister (as is supposed), John, Samuel, and Ann, arrived from Scotland about the year 1636. The marriage of James Allen and Ann Guild is recorded in 1638, this being the only mention of them on record. Samuel was admitted a freeman in 1642, but did not long remain in Dedham. John Guild was admitted to the church in Dedham, July 17, 1640, and made a freeman in 1643. He was one of the original grantees of the town. He married, April 24, 1645, Elizabeth Crooke, of Roxbury. She transferred her relation from the church in Roxbury to the church in Dedham, July 4, 1649. Her death occurred August 31, 1669.
