

DWIGHT GENEALOGY.

John Dwight came from Dedham, England, in 1634, brought with him his wife Hannah, his daughter Hannah, two sons, John and Timothy. He was one of the founders of the Church of Christ, Dedham, Mass., in 1635. Their son

Capt. Timothy Dwight, born in England in 1629, died January 31, 1717, aged 88; married three times. Sarah Libley, November 11, 1651, died May, 1652. Sarah Powell, May 3, 1653. Rev. Josiah Dwight (son of Timothy and Anna Flint), born February 8, 1671, died 1748, aged 77. Graduated at Harvard in 1687, installed in the first Congregational Church, of Woodstock, Conn. in 1690. Married Dec. 4, 1696, Mary Partridge, born 1677, daughter of Col. Samuel Partridge of Hatfield, Mass. and Mahitable Crow of Hartford, Conn. Their son,

John Dwight, born November 7, 1698, died 1758; married March, 1723, Sibyl Hamlin, Middletown, Conn., born October 10, 1704, daughter of Hon. John Hamlin. Their daughter

Anna Dwight, baptized February 24, 1733; married October 12, 1757, Lieut. Zebediah Sabin of Killingsly, Conn., afterwards of Williamstown, Mass., died there in 1806. Their son, Jesse Sabin, born 1770, died in 1856 in Williamstown, Mass.—“a man of piety,”—married Esther Bulkley, born 1780, died in 1834. Their son

Hon. Henry Lyman Sabin, M. D., married Abby Benjamin.
