


Pedigree of Cox, etc., Sussex to Kent.

The Pedigree of Cox at the Heralds' College (Record Book of Norfolk, vol. v., and 15 D. 14) connects with families of Middleton, Miller, Penury, Frankwell, Wood, Burr, Colyer, Knowles, and Walsingham, etc., the first three families of whom were quartered with those of Cox in a Grant of Arms made to Solomon Penury Cox and the descendants of his grandfather, and by augmentation to Joseph Cox, the grantee's brother. Mention of this family is made in Burke's "Visitation of Seats and Arms," First Series, 1852.



Thomas Cox of Rotherfield, co. Sussex, yeoman, living 23 March 1648, as proved by Indenture of Apprenticeship of that date. = A dau. of

Joseph Cox, a minor 23 March 1648, as proved by Indenture of Apprenticeship of that date; afterwards of Chiddingstone, co. Kent, where he purchased an estate called Stokehaw (formerly the possession of Thomas Willoughby of Bore Place) 21 March 1675, and other lands there at Rendlys Hoath 6 Feb. 1699; bur. at Chiddingstone 17 Feb. 1710. His will, in which he is called Joseph Cox, senior, dated 16 May 1704; proved in Prerogative Court of Canterbury 26 Feb. 1710. = Frances, dau. of . . . ; bur. at Chiddingstone 8 Sep. 1697.

Henry Cox of Chiddingstone, bapt. there 15 July 1673; inherited under his father's will, dated 1704, the lands at Rendlys Hoath (purchased 1699); bur. at Eynsford 1 May 1739. Will dated 8 July 1732; proved in Prerogative Court of Canterbury 28 July 1743 by George Pawley, the guardian assigned to William, Mary, Eleanor, Henry, and Barbara Knowles, his grand-nieces and nephews, his nephew and executor Henry Cox being dead. = Elizabeth, dau. of . . . Arnold of Chiddingstone; married at Sevenoaks, co. Kent, 13 Sep. 1702; bur. at Chiddingstone 2 March 1726.

Jonathan Cox, bapt. at Chiddingstone 14 Nov. 1703; bur. there Jan. 1704.

Joseph Cox of Eynsford, co. Kent, bapt. at Chiddingstone 22 Feb. 1668; executor to his father 1710; bur. at Eynsford 25 March 1711. Adm'on granted to his widow Mary in Court of Shoreham Deanery, and which included her husband's moiety of the Stokehaw estate inherited by him with his brother Henry, according to the custom of gavelkind.

Mary, dau. of . . . Gardner; married at Collegiate Church of St. Catherine, by the Tower of London, 12 Oct. 1697; Administratrix to the effects of her father-in-law 7 May 1711. Adm'on of her effects granted to her son Henry at Court of Arches, London, Shoreham, and Croydon 6 Dec. 1726.

Dorothy Cox, born 20 Sep. 1677; bapt. at Chiddingstone 8 Oct.; mentioned in father's will; died 16 Oct. 1714, unmarried.
