To poor of St. Saviour's twenty shillings. To grandchild, Alexander Aylwin, sixty pounds to bind him apprentice. To Richard Aylwin the elder, and to Richard Aylwin the younger, five shillings each. To Rebekah, wife of Michael Sparke of Dartmouth, three pounds. To Cabel Morris, kinsman, George Staplehill, kinsman, and to cousin Gilbert Staplehill and his wife, twenty shillings. To son-in-law, George Kennawt, and his son John; his daughters, Jane Penny and Mary Kennawt (all of Dartmouth), half-a-crown each; to Mary Peter of Dartmouth, and to Susanna Thornecombe of Chichester, five shillings each; to servant, Elizabeth Ball, twenty shillings. To Robert Aylwin, grandson, twenty shillings, and also to Mary Aylwin, granddaughter, sister of above Robert. Residue to son-in-law, John Flavell of Dartmouth, clerk, and kinsman, William Ball of Dartmouth, merchant, executors.

Dated 5 Jan: 1676. Proved 8 Jan: 1677.

Inventory amounted to £140.3.4.

Jone Punchard, of Totnesse, spinster.

To Richard Burthogg, esquire, a mourning ring; also to Mr. John Galpin of Totnesse, and unto Mr. John Galpine of Dartmouth. To Margaret Basse, forty shillings; to Elizabeth Bennet, my servant, five shillings and my working days' apparell of woolling. Rest of goods to dear brother, Isaac Punchard, my sole executor.

Dated 18 June, 1695. Proved 1 Apl: 1696.

(Sealed with a device of 3 lions rampant, 2 and 1.)

Francis Punchard, of Ipplepen, seaman.

To my father, Thomas Punchard, all my woollen clothes; to my sister Amey a ginney; to my sister Joan half-a-crown. Remainder of all goods and money to Joanna Osborn of Ipplepen, junior, whom I doe make my whole executrix.

Dated 9 Sept: 1703. Proved 23 Nov: 1706.

Henry Punchard, of Harberton, mason.

To wife Catherine, enjoyment of all real and personal estate; and on her decease the whole to descend in equal shares to his daughter Catherine, wife of George Searle, and his son John Punchard; and their children. Catherine Punchard, the widow, executrix.

Dated 6 May, 1832. Proved 1839, June 12.

William Punchard, of Denbury, mariner.

To sister Mary, wife of Peter Pitts of Denbury, ten pounds; to Elizabeth, wife of Thomas Gould, five pounds; to Mary Pitts, junior, five pounds. Residue to Margaretta Hoddy of East Stonehouse, widow, executrix.

Dated Mch: 29, 1842. Proved 1842, Dec: 19.
