To daughter, Katherine Lary, apparel, etc.; to Margery, Johan, Ellis, and William, children of Thomas Leurdy, xiii^s iv^d; to Anthony Thorne, "my son", the same. Executor and residuary legatee, Geoffrey Thorne, "my son."

Dated 7 June, 1582. Proved 12 March, 1584. Total of Inventory £xliiii. viii. x., including four kyne, vi^s.

Margaret Pouchard, of Tawstock, widow.

To George Frynde, her wheat; to Thomas Frynde, viii^s; to five of George's other children, iv^d each; the residue to Honor Poncherd, executrix.

Dated 5 Dec: 1583. Proved 7 Apl: 1584. Goods appraised by John Skytche and John Poncherd at xxiii^s v^s.

John Pouchard, of Tawstocke.

To Jone, my daughter, xx^s. Resyde to Alce, my wife, whome I doe make my executrix.

Dated 4 May, 1586. Proved 27 May, 1586. Somme of inventory £xxxiv. xi. vi.

Phellep Pouchard, of the paryshe of Byddyford.

"Jesus, Amen. In the name of God." To every of my godchildren, viii^d a piece; to my goddaughter, Johan Pynckham, a sylver gyrdell with y^e morell and boockle. Residew to M'garet, my wife; and her I ordeyne my sole executrice.

Dated 16th Mch. 1570. Proved 20 Dec: 1589. Inventory some lxi^s viii^s xd.

Margarette Pouchard, of Bydesford, weddowe, late wife of Phillipe Pouchard.

To be buried nere unto my late husband. To son-in-law, John Willa, tow best keys. Unto son John Lake, two other keys. Unto Dorothy Lake, daughter of John Lake, one spruse chiste, my best gowne, and my selver howkes geylt, at the days of her marriage. Unto daughter, Elizabeth Willa, a silver pynne p'cell gylte. Residue unto son-in-law, John Willes, 'my onlye exequitore'.

Dated 20 Jan: 33^e Eliz. Proved 5 Feb: 1590. Inventory suma xiv^s vii^s iv^d.

Humfrey Pouchard, of Tawstocke.
