

Jeremy Punchard. Eye, maltster.

Mary, his wife, sole executrix; all the children of his brother and sisters (no names given).

Dated 29 Oct: 1713. Proved 10 Jan: 1713-4.

Charles Punchard. Pierleston (Billingford) gentleman.

Isabella, his wife, whom he appoints executrix; Sarah, his youngest daughter; Mary, his eldest daughter; Charles, his son, executor.

Dated 1 March, 1720. Proved 20 April, 1725.

Jeremiah Punchard. Farnham St. Martin, yeoman.

Jeremiah Punchard, his father. William Roberts, of Bury, Suffolk, gentleman, to whom he is indebted. Sarah, his wife; John, Jeremy, and Sarah, his children by the said Sarah; Charles, his son; Eliza, his daughter, unmarried. Robert Goodrich, of Farnham All Saints', gentleman. His wife and his brother, John Punchard, executrix and executor.

Dated 27 June, 1725. Proved 12 June, 1729.

John Punchard. Rector of Hasketon, near Woodbridge, Suffolk.

To be buried in Hasketon Church, in a decent but private manner.

Dorothy, his daughter, married to John Clarke, of Woodbridge; Stephen Punchard, of Dennington, his son; Jeremiah Punchard, of Woodbridge, his son. (Mentions that he had settled several sums of money upon the above three children, on their respective marriages). To Stephen Punchard, and his heirs, he leaves his property, copyhold of the Manor of Bedingfield in Rushangles, and land there near the Church, in the occupation of Robert Coats, and also land called "Jakes" in Bedingfield. Katherine Punchard, his daughter, his house in Stone Street, Woodbridge. John Clarke, of Woodbridge, his grandson, all his books, except the MSS. which he had disposed of by private orders left with his executors. To Stephen, his son, the silver tankard given him by his mother (i.e. testator's mother). Jeremy, his son, another tankard; Charity, wife of the said Jeremiah, a silver porringer; Dorothy Clarke, his daughter, a silver porringer; Katharine Punchard, his daughter, a silver porringer. Mr. Philip Candler, Rector of Hollesley, and Mr. Francis Folkard, Rector of Clopton, executors, to each of whom he leaves a ring of a guinea value.

Dated 15 April, 1734. Proved 26 February, 1736-7.

Robert Punchard. Booton, Norfolk, labourer.

William, his brother, of Suffield; John, his son, "now about two years olde"; Benjamin Brown of Booton, executor.

Dated 13 Novr: 1738. Proved same year, no date.

Isabell Punchard. Hoxne, Suffolk, widow.

To be buried at the discretion of her executor; but a stone to be placed at her head, and one at her feet.

John Bryant, her nephew, all her premises in Hoxne; Thomas Bryant, her brother; Mary, wife of John Clemens; Thomas Bryant, her nephew; John Bryant, her aforesaid nephew, brother to the aforesaid Thomas, to be her executor.

Dated 19 Feb: 1741. Proved 12 Dec: 1752.
