ROBERT RAKES (1542, 1544), of Stillingfleet, made his will 29 April, 1577, proved at York 17 June, 1578 [Reg. 21 f, 264 b], to be buried in the churchyard of Stillingfleet; to Anne and Katherine, my daughters, either of them, 10 li.; to my bretheren all my apparell, &c.; my bowe and arrows to John Norfolk; Elizabeth Clarke ("my sister"), my sister Norfolk, and Robert Bowthe, supervisors. He and his brothers, Thomas and Roger (and William of Eskrigg), paid subsidy 34 and 35 Hen. VIII., 1542-3.

DOROTHY (1577); she re-married to William Bewe before 1587.

5. ROGER RAKES (1542, 1544), of Kelfield, and of the parish of Stillingfleet, made his will 24 Nov. 1558, 20 March folig. [Reg. 15, pt. 3 f, 249 b], to be buried in the church or churchyard of Stillingfleet; to his wyfe and childrene all his goodes and catelles and leasses of all his farmold duringe his yeres, and makes them his executors all jointie together.

ROBERT RAIKES, Deputy High Steward of Northallerton, 1699; Mon. Inscr. Northallerton Church, on floor within altar rails; d. 21 March, 1709-10, aged 57, bd. 23rd; will dated 12 June, 1707, proved 11 Aug. 1712, died possessed of Manor of Aislaby, co. Durham, and of lands at Drypoole, &c.; perhaps son of Robert Raikes, of Hedon (see below), and bapt. there 25 April, 1653. *

"AN," widow, bd. at N. 26 Apr. 1726, aged 66, dau. of William Davy.

MARY, wife of Deighton, sister, living 1707; mother of Robert and Anne.

ROBERT RAIKES, Deputy High Steward of Northallerton, 1708; M.P. 1710; Bencher of Gray's Inn, 1728; assumed the name of Fulthorpe; bapt. at N. 1 Nov. 1683; died there 22 June, 1753, bd. 25th within the Chancel.

MARY, eldest dau. of Robert Ellis, M.B. of Siglesthorne, by Elizabeth, his wife, dau. of Rev. C. Fulthorpe, M.A., of Tunstall, co. Durham; m. at Burton Agnes, 10 May, 1720; d. 13 April, 1784, aged 82.
