Isabella, dau. of Rev. John Graham, Rector of Pomeroy and Mullinagore, co. Tyrone; born in 1793; died at Drumreagh 21 November, bur. at New Mills 25 November 1873. Will proved at Armagh 12 December 1873 by John Henry Lowry, the sole Executor.

Elizabeth, of Howard Terrace, Dungannon, co. Tyrone; born at Drumreagh 7 Nov., bapt. at Pomeroy 24 Nov. 1822; confirmed at Dungannon 17 March 1841.

Robert William Lowry of Drumreagh; born at Bernagh, co. Tyrone, 20 March 1824; Lieut.-General in the Army, late Lieut.-General 47th Regiment, served in Crimea, has medal with three clasps, Turkish medal, and 5th class of the Medjidie, C.B., and Colonel Royal Berkshire Regiment; Knight of St. John of Jerusalem.

Emily Rohesia, dau. of Sir Henry George Ward, G.C.M.G., Lord High Commissioner of the Ionian Islands, and Governor of Ceylon and Madras, by Emily Elizabeth his wife, dau. of Sir John Edward Swinburne, Bart., of Capheaton, co. Northumberland; marr. at Corfu 9 June 1853.
