William Chittenden was born at Marden, County Kent, in England, in 1594. Savage says that he served with the English forces in the Netherlands during the "Thirty Years War," and attained the rank of major. He came to Guilford, Ct., in company with his brother-in-law, Rev. Henry Whitfield and others in 1639, in the ship "St. John," from London. He was one of the principal men in the colony in civil and military affairs. He was chosen sergeant of artillery, May 22, 1648, lieutenant in 1653. He served as deputy to the General Court of Connecticut, and as magistrate from 1646 (with the exception of one year) until his death in 1660-1. The names and records of twenty-seven of his lineal descendants of the name of Chittenden appear in "Connecticut Men in the Revolution."

Also great-grandson of CAPT. ETHAN PRATT, (father of Sarah Pratt above) of Saybrook, Ct., and Mabel Skeel||; great<sup>2</sup>-grandson of Daniel Pratt, of Saybrook, Ct., (a soldier in the French war and expedition against Canada in 1755), and Deborah Pratt, (daughter of David Pratt and Sarah Chalker, in the line from Lieut. William Pratt); great<sup>3</sup>-grandson of Daniel Pratt, of Saybrook, Ct., and Mercy Doty (grand-daughter of Edward Doty, who came in the "Mayflower" to Plymouth in 1620. One of his great-grandsons was James Otis, the eminent patriot); great<sup>4</sup>-
