

Also great<sup>3</sup>-grandson of *ABNER PAINE* (father of Eunice Paine, above) of Truro, Mass., and elsewhere, and Jane Doane (a descendant of Deacon John Doane, one of the prominent settlers of Plymouth, Mass., in 1630, or earlier); great<sup>3</sup>-grandson of Major Thomas Paine (an elder, selectman, etc., of Truro, Mass.,) and Thankful Cobb\*; great<sup>4</sup>-grandson of Capt. Thomas Paine (town clerk, selectman, justice of the peace, special justice of Court of Common Pleas, captain of military company, and representative in Provincial Legislature of Massachusetts for years, from Eastham and Truro, Mass.,) and Hannah Shaw†; great<sup>3</sup>-grandson of Thomas Paine (selectman, treasurer, deputy to Colonial court, etc., for many years, from Eastham and Truro, Mass. He came from England with his father before 1639), and Mary Snow (daughter of Nicholas Snow—Plymouth, 1623—and Constance Hopkins, who came with her father *STEPHEN HOPKINS* and his wife Elizabeth in the "Mayflower," to Plymouth in 1620). Among his great-grandsons are Stephen Hopkins, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, and Ezekiel Hopkins, "the first admiral of our National Navy, the co-equal with Washington himself"; great<sup>4</sup>-grandson of Thomas Paine, one of the first settlers of Yarmouth, Mass., and the first deputy from that place to the old Colony court at Plymouth, Mass. He, later, moved to Eastham, Mass. Among his lineal descendants were Robert Treat Paine, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, and John Howard Paine, author of "Home, Sweet Home."

*JAIRUS CHITTENDEN*, born at Guilford, Ct., October 17, 1745; died at Durham, N. Y., March 9, 1828. He was a private in Capt. Daniel Hand's Company of Col. Matthew Talcott's Connecticut State Regiment in the New York expedition of 1776. He enlisted March 22, 1776, and was discharged April 18, 1776. The regiment was engaged in
