

in Old Stoughton, on a street or highway now called Coney Street, not far from East Walpole, and by his wife Sarah had ten children. A copy of his will, dated Dec. 3, 1778, in the Suffolk Probate Records shows the names of their children as given below, and the dates of their several births were taken from the Stoughton Records:—

1. Sarah, b. April 18, 1733; m. Major Aaron Guild, of Dedham *Nov. 1757.*

2. Abigail, b. May 15, 1736; m. a Bullard. *(Edward) m. Feb. 5, 1754.*

4. Nathanael 3d, b. July 11, 1739; m. Mary Clark, of Dedham, June 25, 1767. He d. 1799; she d. 1826. Their Son Nathanael 4th, d. 1855, s. p.
5. John, b. July 6, 1741; m. Keziah Holmes, April 19, 1763.
6. Annah, b. Sept. 1, 1743; m. a Richards.
7. William, b. March 4, 1745.
8. Thomas, b. Oct. 21, 1747; d. July 12, 1821.
9. Elizabeth, b. . . . ; m. a Baker, d. 1775.
10. Mehitabel, b. Sept. 9, 1753.

A stone in the old graveyard at Sharon shows the death of a child, Samuel Conny, in 1759, aged four years, who was doubtless their eleventh child, born in 1755, whose name, of course, would not be found in a will made in 1778.

It is a fact of some interest, and worthy of mention, that Nathanael Conny, Jr., and Deacon Joseph Hartwell (born Aug. 11, 1698, married Dec. 8, 1725, and died Feb. 6, 1786) were neighbors in Old Stoughton as early as 1738. (Suffolk Deeds, book 58, fol. 96.)
