MERITS OF THE COMPOSITION.

All printers fully realize the importance of having their inking rollers in proper condition to do good work, and the constantly changing condition of the old glue and molasses roller has long called for something better, whereby the perplexity, time and expense may be saved, and at the same time better work be secured without that close attention usually required to keep rollers in good order. We call attention to the following as some of the principal advantages of our composition.

It never loses its suction; it never shrinks, as it contains no water or other fluids to evaporate; it always remains moist; it never skins over on the face; it never cracks on the face; can be recast from year to year, thereby saving the material; it does not become hard by cold weather; our rollers are tougher than any others in use, and are not injured by age or climate; they do not require washing at the end of the day's work, as other rollers—ordinary hook ink will not dry on them in four or five days; they are cheaper than ordinary rollers in use, although first cost may be more; as they do not require washing daily like other rollers, there is a saving of ink, time and material; when once set they will not require resetting from day to day, as there is no shrinkage; they are good proof rollers, as ink does not dry on them; an average of two tokens a day more can be worked by use of these rollers on each press.
