Significance:

The U.S. Naval Base at Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964. As a Category 3 structure, it has been determined that Building No. 33 functioned as part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, but is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Historic Landmark.

Description:

Building No. 33 is a two-story reinforced concrete structure with an approximate total area of 41,300 square feet. The northwest side of the building contains a 44 foot by 80 foot concrete wing for a kitchen/food storage area. Building No. 33 consists of concrete beams, walls, concrete roof and floor slabs, and double hung wooden windows with concrete canopy overhangs.

History:

Building No. 33 was constructed in 1942 to serve as a Marine Barracks and Enlisted Dining Facility at a cost of \$176,868. The condition of Building No. 33 is inadequate due to its deteriorated state and its location within the explosive arcs of the Whiskey Wharves at the West Loch Branch of Naval Magazine, Lualualei. In 1983, new Bachelors Enlisted Quarters (Building Nos. 601 and 602) and a new Dining Facility (Building No. 603) were constructed to replace Building No. 33. The new facilities are located outside of the explosive arcs of the Whiskey Wharves. Building No. 33 has been unoccupied since 1983.
