



UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, 746-2311 (Area Code 213)

- Oldest major, private, nonsectarian, coeducational university in the West.
- Founded in 1880 on land donated by a Protestant, a Jew, and a Catholic.
- Three in first graduating class — over 128,000 are degree-holding alumni today.
- Alumni constitute great proportion of professionals in Los Angeles County (48% of judges, 40% of lawyers), and, in southern California, more than 1,700 physicians and 7,500 engineers, two-thirds of the school administrators and social workers, and more than half of the pharmacists, dentists, and architects.
- Elected in 1969 to membership in the Association of American Universities, the most esteemed organization of academic institutions.
- Maximum enrollment 20,000 — more than 50% of outstanding student body in graduate or professional study.
- Nearly 90% of College faculty hold doctoral degrees.
- More new buildings for study, research, and residence constructed since Master Plan announced in 1961 than in USC's first 81 years of existence.
