4. Yet we'll put a - way all sor-row, Smile al-tho' we weep to - mor-row,




In the hearts of maid and lov - er, Anx - ious wife, the sis - ter, broth - er,

And with love and rev' - rence blend - ing O - pen hearts and hands ex - tend - ing,




Fa - ther proud and tear glad moth - er When the boys come home.
