Scope and Content Note

The papers of Silas Casey (1841-1913) span the years 1771-1941, with the bulk of the material falling between the years 1860-1903. The papers include official and general correspondence, a few pieces of personal correspondence, dispatches, orders, a complete set of commissions for each of the ranks attained by Casey, typescript articles, departmental and legislative reports, printed matter, a holograph journal relating to events in which Casey played a role, a Revolutionary War account book, and other material.

The collection includes material on the following subjects: the *Niagara* (frigate) and its cruise to Tokyo, Japan, in 1860-1861 with the Japanese ambassador and his staff; naval actions and blockade movements in the Civil War; the *Colorado* (frigate) and Casey's command of the landing force in the Korean Punitive Expedition of 1871, including photographs and printed matter on the capture of Fort McKee on Kanghoa Island, Korea; the *Portsmouth* (sloop of war), a new type of training ship which operated as a naval school; suspected sabotage of navy yards and arsenals in the Spanish-American War; the *Wisconsin* (battleship) and Casey's role in the Panamanian Revolution of 1903; naval customs of the nineteenth century; and the role of Casey's ancestors in the American Revolution, including Joseph Coggershall's account book of the privateers *Greenwich* (1776), *Marlborough* (1777), and *Providence* (1779).
