Scope and Content Note

The papers of Charles H. Fromuth (1861-1937) span the years 1884-1937, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1889-1934. The collection consists of diaries, autobiographical manuscripts, miscellaneous personal documents, newspaper clippings, exhibition catalogs, receipts, paint palettes, and other papers relating principally to Fromuth's life and work as an American expatriate artist living in France. The material is in English, with some French.
