




A 1,200-pound shell from this army 14-inch high velocity gun dropping near a Boche regiment wouldn't leave a single Heinie in the outfit alive to tell the tale. The unique mount, which permits removal from railway trucks for turntable use on land foundations, was designed before the war. The range is 19 miles.



The "little rifle" at the left, on its wheel mount, would have interfered with the happiness of the Boche over a wide area at a distance of six miles or more. It has a calibre of five inches and two shock-absorbing recoil cylinders.

A sawed-off devastator on its massive railway mount, effective for destroying ammunition dumps, dugouts and cement shelters by plunging fire. Fires a 700-pound projectile nine miles.



A shell from a long-range gun of this type causes terrific havoc at a distance of 26 miles. This piece has a calibre of 12 inches, is operated on a circular railroad track, and is shown at its maximum elevation. The gun is 50 feet long and fires a 700-pound projectile.
