

## Letter from Alexander Graham Bell to Mabel Hubbard Bell, October 9, 1896, with transcript

ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL TO MABEL (Hubbard) BELL Beinn Bhreagh, C. B. Friday, October 9, 1896. Dear Mabel:

I have just torn up a letter I have written to you — and can't write any more tonight.

You evidently don't care for my letters — I will go on with my work — and telegraph anything important.

Your loving husband, Alec. P. S. Poor Daisy wrote you a long warm-hearted letter which was forwarded to you to Washington. She certainly did not deserve the scolding you sent her — which you put into the wrong envelope — to me. You forget that you are running away from your letters — and that nearly all are forwarded to Washington so that they may not be left to the mercy of hotel clerks should you miss receiving them at the Parker or Gilsey.
