D. C. My darling May:

The only way for me to write to you is to keep a rough journal for your benefit. I send you my first Report.

I will keep paper on my study table and try to jot down something every day so as to show you I think of you sometimes.

Your telegrams are still from "Washington." Have you not been to New York? How are you? I wish you would go to New York and see the doctor there. Love to everybody.

Your loving husband, Alec. P. S. Can't open the safe to get out table silver and etc., Don't know the combination. Mr. McInnis ignorant of it too. AGB.
