

## Letter from Alexander Graham Bell to Mabel Hubbard Bell, December 2, 1918, with transcript

ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL TO MABEL (Hubbard) BELL Government House, Halifax, N.S. December 2, 1918. Mrs. A. G. Bell, Baddeck, N. W. My darling Mabel:

Arrived here this afternoon four hours late. Awfully cold journey — glad of my fur overcoat night and day.

The Lieut. Governor and Mrs. Grant and their son, Lieut. Erie Grant, have received me very cordially. After lunch had a beautiful nap — and only wakened up in time to dress for dinner. After dinner went to the Blind Institution where I made my Address to the Canadian Club, upon “Apparent Impossibilities.” Everything passed off well — but I did not have any opportunity of sending you a telegram as I had intended. I lunch with the Canadian Club tomorrow (Tuesday) and the Lieut. Governor give a dinner party in the evening. Off for Boston Wednesday morning (December 4th).
