

Letter from Alexander Graham Bell to Gardiner Greene Hubbard, September 7, 1897

869 September 7th. 1897. Dear Mr. Hubbard:

I enclose a letter from Mr. Gillespie showing that he is about to be be-headed, and a "free silver man" put in his place.

You know Mr. Gillespie, and the great work he is doing in Nebraska, not only for the deaf, but for hard of hearing persons as well.

He should be encouraged, and helped. But just how to do this is the question, and therefore I write to you to ask your advice.

Please return his letter with yours at your convenience.
