

Letter from Alexander Graham Bell to Samuel P. Langley, February 14, 1902

389 February 14, 1902. Prof. S. P. Langley, Smithsonian Institution. Dear Prof. Langley: —

I have written to Mr. Lucas concerning the model of Triceratops, and picture of the Pterodactyle in flight, and I write now to remind you of the photograph of the sun that you were kind enough to say you would allow us to see on Wednesday evening next. I think you said that you would see about having a suitable box made for exhibiting the photograph to be illuminated behind by electric lights. Of course, I shall be glad to pay for any expenses you incur in preparing the transparency for exhibition here.

Many thanks for your interest and help. I need hardly say that we should all appreciate very highly any other material that you think would interest us. I would also be very much gratified if you could spare time to be with us yourself on Wednesday evening.
